My name is Ed Cotter, and I am the Project Director for Nordic Aquafarms. In recent consultation with the Belfast Planning Department, we were advised that we needed to request a Letter of No Impact from the school district in regards to our proposed project. For background, we anticipate to total of 100 employees at full completion, with the first wave of new employees starting in about 2 yrs, and full capacity somewhere between 5-7 yrs from now.
